must be filed with the Race Committee before 6:00 P.M. of the week day following the race. A yacht having cause to protest another yacht for infringement of these rules, occurring during a race, must promptly display a white flag (a handkerchief may be used) and keep such flag flying until she has finished the race.

2. Hearings. Hearings will be held by the Race Committee as shortly after a protest is received as possible. It will be the duty of the protesting skipper and the skipper of the boat protested to be present at said hearing.

The Race Committee will keep in view the ordinary customs of the sea and discourage all attempts to win a race by other means than fair sailing, superior speed and skill.



RACING RULES

The Board of Governors has adopted for the 1935 season the Racing Rules of the N. A. Y. R. U., copies of which may be had from the chairman of the Race Committee at a cost of \$.50.

HANDICAPPING

In all handicap classes yachts will be handicapped according to their rating under the Universal Rule.

Any yacht is eligible for any event in her class provided that her Measurement Certificate is in the hands of the Chairman of the Race Committee before 5:00 P. M. on the second day previous to that of the event.

MEASUREMENT

The owner of every yacht starting in any race shall have placed on file with the Chairman of the Race Committee a valid Measurement Certificate signed by the Club Measurer, showing the rating of the yacht as computed in accordance with the rules of the Club. The Board of Governors has adopted for the 1935 season the Measurement Rule of the N. A. Y. R. A. under the Universal Rule of Measurement. The measurer is Davenport West, Jr.

POINT SCORING

Each yacht will be credited with points according to the following schedule:

- 1. Divide the figure 100 by the number of yachts starting in each race and obtain the quotient. The winner will be credited with 100; the second with 100 lass the quotient: the third with 100 less twice the quotient; etc. The last yacht will be credited with the quotient.
- 2. A yacht that starts and does not finish, or that withdraws, or is disqualified, will not receive any points but will be counted as a starter and must be figured in determining the quotient.
- 3. In the event of a tie both boats will receive the same number of points. Should two boats have the same

number of points for the series the winner will be determined either by a sail-off or by the spin of a coin, the decision to rest with the Race Committee and skippers involved.

4. "Sail-overs" will not be allowed.

5. Three shall be the minimum number of starters in a race in order that such a race shall count as one of a series.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALL CLASSES

- 1. Starting Line: between Committee Boat (amidships) and the starting buoy.
- 2. Finish Line: between the Committee Boats mast and the starting buoy.
- 3. Letters indicating the course to be sailed will be displayed on the Committee Boat with the warning signal.
- 4. Code flag G (yellow and blue pennant) will indicate race is postponed (postponements will be for fifteen minute periods).
- 5. Letters of Turning Marks will be displayed from the Committee Boat in the order in which they are to be rounded. If the signals displayed indicate that the second turning mark is to port of the first turning mark, leave both to port. If the second turning mark is to starloard of the first, leave both to starboard. If only one mark is indicated, leave it to starkoard. See chart on last page for location of turning marks.

PROTESTS

1. All protests must be made in writing, signed by the owner or his representative, and must name the rule or rules alleged to have been infringed and contain a statement of the facts, including a diagram showing courses of yachts, direction of wind and current. They
